negro slaves one fellow named Peter one woman Edith and one girl named Rachels also all my stock of every
description including horses cattle sheep hogs and also all my various tools and kitchen furniture plantation
implements &c. to have and to hold the said negro slaves and above mentioned property and the fullness thereof
and profits arising therefrom to the only purpose and behoof of him the said John Claude his heirs
adm and assigns forever and I the said William Claude for myself my heirs adm and assigns against one the said
negro slaves and other property to the said John Claude his heirs adm and assigns against one the said
William Claude my heirs adm and assigns and against all and every other person and persons who here
after shall and will maintain and forever defend by these presents binding whereof I have hereunto

three between Britton Britt and Temperance his wife of Southampton County Virginia of the one part
and James Edwards of the same County and state of the other part containing that the said Britton Britt
and Temperance his wife for and in consideration of the sum of fifty dollars to them in hand paid before
the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is acknowledged they the said Britton
Britt and Temperance his wife have granted bargained sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents
do grant bargain sell and confirm unto him the said James Edwards his heirs and assigns forever their interest
in a certain piece or lot of land containing one acre more or less being on the east side of railroad river or run
and below Lewis's first bounded as follows viz Beginning at a cypress corner tree near deposits the mouth of
the said river but running thence down the river to a white oak thence to an Elm paralleled with the
river thence up the river to the said cypress the first corner tree is there and to hold the said lot of land
together with its appurtenances to him the said James Edwards his heirs and assigns forever and they the
said Britton Britt and Temperance his wife for themselves their heirs adm and assigns do and make by these
presents warrant and defend the bargained premises against the lawful claim or claim and of all and
every person whatsoever to him the said James Edwards and to his heirs and assigns forever in testimony
