This Indenture made this 17<sup>th</sup> February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen between Johnstone Brooks and Rebecca Williamson his wife of the first part and Arthur Williamson of the second part witnesseth that the said Johnstone Brooks and Rebecca his wife for and in consideration of the sum of fifteen dollars current money of Virginia in hand paid by the said Arthur Williamson the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents do grant to Johnstone Brooks above enfeoffed and conform unto the said Arthur Williamson his heirs and assigns forever an certain tract or parcels of land lying in the County of Southampton and containing two and a half acres by lot surveying it being a part of the tract or common known as and cut off of the south end of said land by a line running west and east together with the appurtenances thereto, or in any way appertaining unto the revision and rurasions whatsoever rents issues and profits of the said premises and former part and parcel thereof are also all the estate right title interest claim and demands whatsoever of them the said Johnstone Brooks and Rebecca his wife of or unto to the said tract or parcels of land and premises and every part thereof to have and to hold the said tract of land and premises and every part and parcel thereof with the appurtenances unto the said Arthur Williamson his heirs and assigns to the uses hereinafter and before of him the said Arthur Williamson his heirs so forever and the said Johnstone Brooks and Rebecca his wife and their heirs the said tract or parcels of land and premises with its appurtenances unto the said Arthur Williamson his heirs so against the claim and demands of all persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and by these presents forever assign to witness whereby the said parties parties have executed set their hands and seals to the above any and a late
