

It shall and may be lawful for the said Lewis Morrell his Executors or administrators to dispose of the before described negroes and slaves at publick auction for raising money at the best rate in the said County of Southampton giving at least twenty days previous publick notice of the time and place of such sale by advertisement published in at least three publick places in the aforesaid County and that the proceeds of such sale after paying and satisfying all costs attending the execution of this trust be applied to the discharge of the aforesaid debt & interest which may have accrued thereon or so much thereof as may then be due and if any surplus thereafter remaining in the hands of the said Lewis Morrell his Executors the same shall be paid over to the said Joseph J. Soper his heirs Executors administrators or assigns but in case the said entire and costs aforesaid be paid before or at the time of being thereto required as aforesaid then and in that case the said Lewis Morrell his Executors or assigns shall return to the said Joseph J. Soper all the right title enclosed and estate hereby conveyed to them or trust and to the said Joseph J. Soper do by these presents forever warrant and defend the right and title of the before said negroes and slaves against the claim and demand of him the said Joseph J. Articles of agreement made and entered into this 20th day of November on the year Eighteen hundred and twenty two between Edward Sundry of the County of Southampton and Heirs of originall of the one part and Arthur Williamson of the County and State of Virginia of the other part Witnesseth that the said Edward Sundry has this the above sayd and date long since and dole not Arthur Williamson the balance of the tract of Land on which the said Sundry's own land not above 100 acres the said Arthur Williamson on the following terms viz for the part to the said Edward Sundry own land or possession that not subject to his nucleus owns the said Arthur Williamson is to give the said Sundry twenty shillings per acre for by paying a Sundryman now obtains in Southampton Court on the said Sundry and Arthur Williamson the common bond and the balance to be paid to the said Sundry by creating his bond which is due from the said Sundry to the said Williamson the credit to be given on the twenty fifth of December next on the Arthur Williamson getting a good and lawful title and possession to the same the Quarterly is to be attended by taking sixty and one fourth acres from the amount of his purchase allotted him the said Edward Sundry by the Commissioners who divide his father's land between him and his mother twenty Sundry and one fourth acre being the quantity thereof for sale the said Arthur Williamson by the said Edward Sundry and conveyed by former said the balance of said tract being subject to the same mortgage of his Mother Katha Gordon is sold by the said Sundry to the said Williamson on the following terms viz The said Sundry on is to give the said Sundry ten dollars again for the quantity in debt on condition that the said Sundry shall have it in his power either by the death of the seller or purchaser of her might to give the possession of the same to the said Arthur Williamson together with a good and lawful title on or before the twenty fifth day of December Eighteen hundred and twenty three but in case the said Edward Sundry should fail to make the said title and give the possession on or before that day the said Williamson is to give the said Sundry then dollars and the five and sixteenth of the said dollars as before mentioned in which case the payment to be made on getting possession together with a good and lawful title to the said above part of the said tract of Land by settlement of the said Edward Sundry bond or bonds and arrears due the said Williamson from the said Sundry in the subscriber is acknowledged this article to contain a true statement of a bargain and sale made and entered into this the above sayd and date before written in presence of
