This Indenture made this 17th day of July 1832 Between Benjamin Cobb of the first part John Mughart
husband of the second part and Jeremiah Cobb of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State
of Virginia whereas the said Jeremiah Cobb by his deed dated the 20th day of February one thousand eight
hundred and fifteen and admitted to record in the County Court of Southampton the 16th day of October
in the same year in order to secure the payment at the sum therein specified of the sum of fifteen
hundred dollars owing by him the said Jeremiah Cobb to him the said John Mughart conveyed in trust
to the said Benjamin Cobb a certain tract of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing
by estimation four hundred and forty four acres a half acre more or less by reporved to the said and
will more fully appear and the said sum of fifteen hundred dollars ²⁰⁰⁰ having been fully paid by the said
Jeremiah Cobb to the said John Mughart he the said Jeremiah Cobb hath requested that the estate
conveyed by the said deed of trust to him the said Benjamin Cobb be now released to him the said
Jeremiah Cobb This Indenture therefore witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and
also for and in consideration of one dollar by the said Jeremiah Cobb to the said Benjamin Cobb in
hand paid before the reciting and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
by the said Benjamin Cobb with the consent of the said John Mughart signified by this being a party
thereto have granted remised released and forever quit claimed and by these presents do fully &
absolutely grant remise release and forever quit claim unto the said Jeremiah Cobb his heirs and
spouse forever all the estate right title interest property claim and demand whatsover in law
or equity of him the said Benjamin Cobb of in and to the aforesaid tract of Land with the
appurtenances thereto and to him the aforesaid tract of Land with its appurtenances to the said Jeremiah
Cobb his heirs and assigns to the only and chief of the said Jeremiah Cobb his heirs and assigns
forever so that the said Benjamin Cobb over his heirs nor any other person whatsoever claim or lay
to him shall by any way or means hereafter have claim challenging or demand any estate right title
or interest of in or to the said premises or any part or any part thereof but from all estate right title
interest or demand of in or to the said premises or any part thereof they are excepted whom shall be
entirely excluded and barred forever by these presents In witness whereof the parties to this
