This Indenture made this 29th day of January 1823 between Henry Gardner and Philip the one
of the County of Southampton and Parish of Newbury of the one part and John Vicks of the same County
and parish of the other part Witness that the said Henry Gardner and wife for and in consideration of
the sum of twenty dollars lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said John Vicks the receipt
whereof the said Henry Gardner and wife doth acknowledge themselves fully and amply satisfied and do
both granted bargained and sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents hath granted
bargained and sold unto the said John Vicks one certain tract or parcel of land and premises
situate lying and being in the County aforesaid containing by estimation twenty two and a half
acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit beginning corner tree on Henry
Gardner land thence said corner line a corner to a line and from corner of said line line
a line of new marked trees a cross the road to a swamp or rather black creek swamp to
a green corner between said Gardner and said Vicks thence up the said swamp to the corner of
Gardner's rooms to the first station together with all houses out houses edifices buildings lands
Gardner orchard way water and water courses whatsoever and all the right title interest claims
belonging or in any use appurtenant to the same and is had the said land unto the said John Vicks
to him and to his heirs forever and them the said Henry Gardner and wife for themselves and
their heirs with by their presents consent and grant to and with the said John Vicks the sum
and assigns that they will and forever defend all right title claims and
of any person or persons claiming or demanding the same or any part or parcel thereof the
witness whereof the said Henry Gardner and wife (they) both hereunto set their hands and
affixed their seals this day and year above mention
