This Indenture made the 5 January in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty three between George Jonyans Esqy his wife of the first part and Arthur Williamson of the second part intendeth that the said George Jonyans Esqy his wife for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred and thirty dollars current money of Virginia in hand paid by the said Arthur Williamson the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold aliened conveyed and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain and sell aliened and confirmed unto the said Arthur Williamson his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton and containing one hundred and six acres by late survey and bound set as follows first beginning at a stake a corner of Arthur Williamson's line on a line of Davis Thomas' or places thence along the said Williamson's line to the line of Edward Peck thence along the said Peck's line to the main run of the then created thence down the said Creek to a mark given a corner to John Washland thence along this line southerly and a half degree east one hundred and forty seven and a half poles to a small gum or Red Oak branch thence up the bank as it meanders to a old mill dam thence along a ditch south thirty three degrees East nine and a half poles to a corner of said ditch thence north sixty one and a half degrees East twenty seven poles to an oak a corner to Arthur Williamson's thence along his line south to only one and a half degrees west six poles to the estate of David Thomas thence along the said line south fifty six and seven degrees west fifty six poles thence south sixty one and a half degrees west seventy and a half poles to the beginning together with the appurtenances thereto or on any side appurtenances and the residue and overland remains and remainars voids spaces and parts of the said premises and forever part and parcel thereof and also all the hereto right title interest claim and demand whatsoever of them the said George Jonyans Esqy his wife of or and to the said tract or parcel of land and premises and every part or parcel thereof to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land and premises and every part and parcel thereof with the appurtenances unto the said Arthur Williamson his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of them the said Arthur Williamson his heirs the said George Jonyans Esqy and his wife his heirs and assigns and their heirs the said tract or parcel of land and premises with all appurtenances and with the said Arthur Williamson his heirs to against the claim and demand of all and persons whatsoever shall and lawfully remain and by these presents forever defend in witness whereof the said parties have hereunto set their hands and shall thus the above day and date signed sealed and acknowledged in presence of Alexander P.
