Mrs. Indenture made and entered into this twelfth day of February one thousand eight
 hundred and twenty three between Ann Harrijs of the County of Southampton of the first
 part Gray S. Suddens trust friends to Ann T. Capelle Harrijs S. Capelle and Elizabeth S. Capelle
 infants children of James Capelle and Penelope C. Capelle the wife of the second part and con-
 sidered in this order and appointed by the said Ann Harrijs of the third part whereby she
 that the said Ann Harrijs hath for the natural love and affection she bears to the said Ann
 infant children and for the further sum of One dollar in hand paid by the said William Suddens
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents
 do grant bargain and sell unto the said William Suddens the following property to wit One
 Bureau Eight bottom plates one primer dish nine primer spoons one set of knives and forks twelve
 primer plates four primer basins One large Candle stick Eighteen random plates five random
 plates two random bowls three dishes one tea pot One Coffee mill two beds and furniture One low
 broad bed One walnut dressing table One blue chest One bed and the quilt two iron pots one wash
 pan and spewer and led One iron cooking nest all one and bottom chairs two set vases one box
 all trunk four glass bottle one chair bed one large Bible one tea table two spinning wheels
 two bands boxes one painted eight ball box three trunks two quilts one pair cut
 wheels three boxes one small stove two glass barrels one glass hatchet one silver docket two paper
 boxes sack cellar mirror cruet four tin cups tin coffee pot Coffee mill soap stone tapers
 fringe Lamb flask where one silver tea spoon one natural knife two one corn one corn eggs
 and above in trust constituted it is agreed upon and understood between the parties that if the
 death of the said Ann Harrijs the said William Suddens may and shall allow the said
 mentioned property to remain in the possession of the said Penelope C. Capelle for the benefit of
 her children Ann T. Capelle Harrijs S. Capelle and Elizabeth H. Capelle or so many of her children
 as may then be living (lawful issue of her body as well those that may hereafter be born
 as those before married and at the death of the said Penelope C. Capelle the said William Suddens
 shall deliver to the said Gray S. Suddens or assigns he be then dead to the Sanfelle Guardian
 of the said Ann T. Capelle the Bureau and small trunk mentioned above for the benefit of her
 the said Ann T. Capelle alone and the the said William Suddens shall also deliver at the same time
 to the said Gray S. Suddens or in case of his death to the Sanfelle Guardian of the said Harrijs
 S. Capelle the large Bible left above for the benefit alone and at the same time the the said Ann
 Suddens shall deliver to the said Gray S. Suddens or to the Sanfelle Guardian of Elizabeth
 Capelle the walnut dressing table mentioned above for his benefit alone and furthermore the
 William Suddens and even a debt shall and may make sales of the balance of the above
 mentioned property at the death of the said Penelope C. Capelle for the best price that can be
 had and the proceeds thereof the said William Suddens shall equally divide among the surviving
 children of the said Penelope C. Capelle or assigns they not be of lawful age or their next friend
 Gray S. Suddens or their Sanfelle Guardian and the said William Suddens may and shall
 at all times between this and the time of General distribution have it or his power to receipt
 waste or any improper distribution of the before mentioned property and freedom in the
 said Ann Harrijs shall and will warrant and forever defend the title to the said William Suddens
 good and lawful to the said William Suddens for their own sakes for own and for the true
 performance of each and every of the said Covenants and agreements and the parties to these
 presents have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first above written
