

This Indenture made this 4th day of March 1623 between Drury Albarn or Drury Smith of the County of Sussex and state of Virginia of the first part and Thomas Jones of the County of Southampton (then County) and state aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of fifty dollars to the said Drury Albarn or Drury Smith in hand paid by the said Thomas Jones the receipt whereof the said Drury Albarn or Smith doth hereby acknowledge have granted bargained and sold and do by these presents grant bargain and sell unto the said Thomas Jones a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton the boundaries of which well fully appear by reference to the deed from Southampton filed to the said Drury Albarn or Smith and containing by estimation more or less of land by the same more or less to have and to have to the said land with all the privileges appertaining therunto to have the said Thomas Jones to him and his heirs forever and I do hereby acknowledge that I am fully satisfied for the same and as foregoingly expressed hath been and agrees forever warrant and defend the rights and title of said land unto the said Thomas Jones his heirs forever and agrees forever in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and date above written

This Indenture made this 28th day of December in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two between Benjamin Blount of the County of Southampton of the one part and Solomon Blount of the same County of the other part witnesseth that the said Benjamin Blount in consideration of one hundred and sixty dollars lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Solomon Blount at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Solomon Blount his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances situate lying and being in the County of Southampton on the south side of the flat Swamp containing one hundred and fourteen and a half acres to the same more or less and bounded as follows To wit beginning at a small perpendicular tree on John Byrnes Corner run James Jacksons thence North Eighty five degrees west fifty five pole thence due north six pole to the run of a small branch thence up the said branch one hundred and twenty pole to an oak in said Jacksons line thence north fifty five degrees west thirty six pole to an old white oak a corner in John Thomas line run John Blount thence along the said Blounts line north fifty two degrees west thirty six pole to a white oak thence north fifty degrees East one hundred and twenty pole to a pine thence north ten degrees west forty pole to a hickory thence north fifty seven degrees west thirty six pole to a pine in James Harp line run the estate of James Thomas and so thence along said Thomas line North seventy eight degrees East one hundred and twenty pole to a pine in Bush line thence North ten degrees west forty five pole to the beginning of these and to hold the said one hundred and fourteen and a half acres of land together with all the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining and all the premises go to the only proper use and behoof of the said Solomon or his heirs and assigns forever free from the let hindrance or incumbrance of the said Benjamin Blount his heirs or assigns or any person or persons claiming the same whosoever shall come and as in warrant and forever defend by these presents the more up holding the said Benjamin Blount have hereunto set his hands and seal the day and year first above written signed sealed and delivered in the presence of
