Third Indenture made and entered into on the 17th day of February in the Year of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and twenty three between George Whitfield & Polly Whitfield his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Jacob Barnes of the same County and State of the other part testifies that the said George Whitfield and Polly his wife for and remuneration of the sum of two hundred dollars amount money of this Commencement to him in hand paid by said Jacob Barnes at or before the date hereof and delivery of these presents the full receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto him the said Jacob Barnes and his heirs forever one certain tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of Saint Sufet Containing by a late Survey fifty acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows Beginning at the centre of four small white round poles standing near the first cross on the south side a new Corner made between said George Whitfield and Polly his wife and Jacob Barnes in line thence along a new line of markers two miles between them North sixty six degrees East 110 poles to a small soft oak standing on a small branch thence down the run of said branch South 52 1/2 degrees East 51 1/2 poles thence South 50 1/2 degrees East 50 poles to a green pine thence through the field 51 1/2 poles to the center of the Cypress road a new Corner made between the said George Whitfield and Polly his wife and Jacob Barnes in said Jacob Barnes' line thence down the road along said Jacob Barnes' line at W 1/2 S 81 1/2 degrees thence N 25 1/2 degrees to the run of a small branch corner of a new Corner in said Jacob Barnes' line thence up said branch the various courses thereof along said (Branch) thence down to Simmons Barnes line thence along said Simmons Barnes line to a Maple standing in the run of said branch in said Simmons Barnes line thence N 1/2 S 1/2 degrees to a small tree thence N 1/2 S 1/2 degrees to the corner of the field 55 1/2 poles thence N 1/2 S 1/2 degrees to a dead pine thence down a new line 109 poles thence S 1/2 S 1/2 degrees to 20 poles thence S 1/2 S 1/2 degrees to 10 poles thence S 1/2 S 1/2 degrees to a lightened stump standing near the said first cross a corner of said Jacob Barnes' line thence N 1/2 S 1/2 degrees to Simmons Barnes and thence along said line 52 1/2 poles to the first Station together with all right title interest claim or demand of or to the said tract of Land and premises with its appurtenances in any and every appurtenance or thereto belonging to him and to his heirs the said Jacob Barnes and his heirs forever and the said George Whitfield and Polly
