confirm and by these presents do give grant bargain sell enfeoff and confirm unto the said Dixon Burgason
his heirs and assigns forever in certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the aforesaid
County of Smithampton Beginning at a lightwood stake a corner in the said Dixon Burgason John Parvett
and Edward Jones land thence along the lower line of marked tree to a bequered corner in Leonard
Cobb's line thence along the said Cobb's line to a cluster of four white oaks a corner in Madam Brown's
line an of said Brown's line thence along the said Brown's line to a corner in John Parvett's line thence along
said Parvett's line to the first Station Concerning by alternation thence across to the same more or less
together with wood Meadow wood houses orchards vines meadows waters and water Courses and all and
every appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining unto the said property and on
