This Indenture made the <sup>1st day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three by and between John Hargrave and Catharine his wife of the County of Southampton
in the State of Virginia and in the lower district of Saint Luke parish of the one part and
John Ferguson of the same state County and parish of the other part Wimbleton that the said John
Hargrave and Catharine his wife for and consideration of the sum of two hundred and twenty five
dollars to them in hand paid by the said John Ferguson at or before the sealing and delivery of these
presents the receipt whereof they the said John Hargrave and Catharine his wife do hereby acknowl-
edge themselves fully satisfied Contented and paid have bargained sold aliened exchanged and confer-
med and by these presents doth hereby bargain and sell alien exchange and convey to the said
John Ferguson his heirs and assigns a certain meadow plantation tract or parcel of land situated
lying and being in the County aforesaid Containing fifty acres to the same more or less bounded as follows
Beginning at a stake in Sally Woods line thence south by Albany Slaggets line to a pine in Slaggets line thence
thence down the Slaggets line to a black Oak a corner of John Hargrave in
Slaggets line thence north a straight line of about 10 rods to a small pond a corner of John Hargrave
in William Ferguson line thence nearly westwards to a rightwood post in William Fergusons line
thence north to a maple a corner in Alfred Stoney line from thence to the beginning of together with all houses and
houses gardens orchards ways waters and waters and woods and minerals and all other the
profits and commodities thereunto belonging or in any way appertaining to have and to hold the said land
premises with the appurtenances unto the said John Ferguson his heirs and assigns in the follow-
ing manner that is to say that the said John Hargrave and Catharine his wife will the time of
signing and sealing of these presents doth lawfully discharge and pay his and every part and parcel thereof and
the said John Hargrave and Catharine his wife further doth their executors administrators and assigns
doth covenant grant and agree to and with the said John Ferguson his heirs and assigns in the follow-
ing manner that is to say that the said John Hargrave and Catharine his wife will a good right and lawfully
make and give Estate in fee simple and that the same is fully freely and clearly aquitted of
from all former gold grants and mortgages dower and jointure and of any from any manner of encumbr-
ances whatsoever and that the said John Hargrave and Catharine his wife hath a good right and lawfully
Obligatory to sell and convey the said tract plantation or parcel of land unto the said John Ferguson to have
and assignees forever and lawfully the said bargained premises with the appurtenances unto the said John Ferguson
his heirs and assigns that they the said John Hargrave and Catharine his wife who warrant and forever
defend by these presents against the lawfull claim of all and every person and persons whatsoever to anything what-
soever they the said John Hargrave and Catharine his wife both forgoote let their land to their sole affid 1823
