This Indenture made this twentieth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty two by and between Edmund Murphy and Lydia his wife of Southampton County Virginia of the first part and Stanley Corp of Southampton County and State aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that they the said Edmund Murphy and Lydia his wife for and consideration of one thousand dollars to them the said Edmund Murphy Lydia his wife or her hand paid by the said Stanley Corp at and before the inserting and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is fully acknowledged they the said Edmund Murphy and Lydia his wife have granted bargains and sales alined and confirmed unto by these presents to grant bargains sell alien and confirm unto from the said Stanley Corp his heirs and assigns forever the Ferry across Weyanoke River in the County of Southampton aforesaid formerly called Brauns Ferry together with the Ferry flat rope and other appendages of the said Ferry with all and singular the privileges rents species and appurtenances to the same belonging including a small piece of land lying on the east side of the river bounded by the river and Richard Edwards land and whether several acres has been taken into and considered as being a part of and properly attached to the ferry privilege also a small piece of land being on the west side of the river immediately at the ferry landing bounded as follows to begining at the post rate to which the flat rope is run the river running thence Eighty five yards in a southwardly direction to a Chincapin post thence running easterwardly down the river by a line parallel thereto to a third post thence to a Chincapin post thence northward Eighty five yards to the river thence up the river to the beginning including a small house now standing on the said piece of land to have and to hold the said Ferry flat rope and other appendages with the pieces or lots of land annexed unto all and singular the rents species profits and emoluments to have the said Stanley Corp and to his heirs and assigns forever and they the said Edmund Murphy and Lydia his wife for themselves their heirs executors and administrators do and will by these presents warrant and forever defend the said bargains premises against the lawful claim or demands of and every person or persons whatsoever to have the said Stanley Corp and to his heirs and assigns forever By testimony whereof they the said Stanley Corp and Lydia his wife have wrote their hands and affixed their seals this day and year above mention

This Indenture made this 14<sup>th</sup> day of February 1832 between Samuel Holliday and Joseph Brumy both of the County of Southampton aforesaid that the said Edmund Murphy for and consideration of the sum of the sum of six hundred dollars to him in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged to the said Edmund Murphy have granted bargains and sales and by these presents to grant bargains and sales unto the said Joseph Brumy and to his heirs and assigns on certain tract or parcel of land containing by estimation twenty acre in the same more or less for a sum particular mentioned agreeable to the deed of plantation Joseph Brumy and wife to Sam'l Holliday unto me myself appear to have and to have the said tract of land with its appurtenances to the said Joseph Brumy for there are expenses forever to the said Samuel Holliday for Convey the same unto the aforesaid tract or parcel of land to the said Joseph Brumy for there are expenses unto warrant and former expenses by these presents
