I know all men by these presents that I George Blunt of Norfolk County North Carolina for and in consideration of two hundred and eighty dollars lawful money of Virginia to me in hand paid by Thomas C Jones of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged I have granted bargained and sold and do by these presents grant bargain and sell to him the said Thomas C Jones one certain negro woman named Cato which said negro woman has for some time been a runaway and is at this time runaway but I do permit myself my heirs heirs heirs and assigns and all and every person or persons whatsoever male and so by these presents warrant and sell forever defend all right (little) claims or titles to him the said Thomas C Jones his heirs and assigns forever Witness my hand and seal this fifth day of April 1823

This Indenture made and entered into this twentieth day of March in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and twenty three by and between Elzy Reed of Southampton County Virginia of the first part and Simon Ableson of the same County and State of the second part and James Horseshoeburg of the same County and State of the third part Whereas the said Elzy Reed died on the Year 1821 Executed a note to the said Simon Ableson for the sum of twenty three dollars and fifty cents and more payable on the 30th day of the month of December after the execution of the said note and the said Simon Ableson did on the year 1822 assign the said note to Lewis Bryant and the said Bryant paid it over to Andrew Allington Harvey and the said Harvey has bought and on the same when the said Elzy Reed being deceased to indemnify the said Simon Ableson in reward of his making himself liable for the said debt to the said Bryant but more especially for the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by him the said James Horseshoeburg before the execution and delivering of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Elzy Reed hath granted bargained and sold to him the said James Horseshoeburg this house and appurtenances hereto the house three feather beds and furniture two Corns and appurtenances three Haystacks one cart and wheel all the Timber sold and Kitchen furniture all of the plantation utensils and all of the stock of hay to him the said James Horseshoeburg his heirs and assigns forever upon the following condition that is to say that if the said Simon Ableson shall be caused to pay off the said note and stop the said note and in that case it shall be lawful for the said Simon Horseshoeburg to come as agreed in writing from man the hand of him the said Simon Ableson then him or assigns to let off and sell the before mentioned property or so much as were discharge the said debt as cost of the said note depending and all cost pertaining thereto after giving at least ten days notice by advertisement to be set up at three of the most public places in the neighborhood for ready money and out of the money so raised he shall pay the debt and all costs pertaining to the
