This Indenture made this twentieth day of February in the Year of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and twenty two between John Blunt of the County of Southampton of the one part and James Jackson of the said County of the other part witnesseth that the said John Blunt for and consideration of the sum of twelve hundred dollars current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said James Jackson the receipt whereof the said John Blunt doth hereby acknowledge to be fully satisfied and paid hath bargained and sold aliened and confirmed and doth by these presents fully and absolutely grant bargain sell and confirm unto the said James Jackson his heirs or assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land containing four hundred twenty acres thereof acres to the same more or less lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid and bounded as following beginning at a pine a corner of Davis Days and John Jones Land formerly but now owned by Benjamin Blunt thence south fifty two degrees East ten furlongs and eighteen pole to a red oak three hundred thirty three south eighteen and a half degrees east being next to a black gum in the pecun branch north forty seven degrees East one furlong and thirty pole to a post oak North forty degrees West thirty four pole to a dead oak with four Eight degrees west bearing four pole to a white oak and forty three degrees East one hundred and thirty four pole to a pine north twenty two and a half degrees west by five pole to a Hickory north fifty seven degrees west twenty three pole to a pine north forty seven and a half degrees west by six pole to a black gum North seventy one degrees west fifty pole to a white oak with thirty seven degrees west one hundred and twenty six pole to a pine south forty five degrees east twenty six pole to a post oak thence to the beginning one hundred and thirty four pole at last and to have the said four hundred and forty nine acres and a half acres of Land together with all the appurtenances thereto belonging or may here affinny and all its franchises to the only proper use of him the said James Jackson his heirs and assigns forever but from the let hindrance or encumbrance of the said John Blunt his heirs or assigns or any person or persons claiming the same by him or under him the said John Blunt clear of all due taxes rights or any other encumbrance whatever to the only proper use of him the said James Jackson his heirs or assigns forever and the said John Blunt further promises to and with the said James Jackson his heirs and assigns forever In witness whereof the said John Blunt hath hereunto set his hand and affixes his seal the day and year aforesaid signed sealed & delivered in presence of
