I know all men by these presents that S Sally Everett of Southampton County and State of Virginia have made ordained constituted and appointed and by these presents do make ordain constitute and appoint them Test and Samuel Poete of Madison County and State of Alabama my Two and full attorneys for me & in my name but to my use to ask demand sue for recover and receive of all whom soever of the County of Madison or the State of Alabama a certain negro slave named Ned which said negro slave I claim as my own property and owing from the aforesaid William Wofford of the County of Madison and State of Alabama to me the said Sally Everett and in default of payment thereof to have used and taken all lawful ways and means in my name or otherwise for the recovery of the said negro slave named Ned and on receipt thereof acquittance or other sufficient discharge for the same for me in my name to make seal and deliver and to do all lawful acts and things whatsoever concerning the same as fied and in every respect as I might or could do if I were personally present and attorney under them the said Thomas and Samuel Poete for the purpose aforesaid to make and appoint & every such appointment at the pleasure to revoke & ratifying and confirming all and whatever my attorney shall in my name lawfully do or cause to be done in and about the same by virtue of these presents.
