This Indenture made this 13th day of April in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred thirty three between Sally Brister of the County of Southampton of the one part and Reffus Hart of the County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Sally Brister for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and twenty dollars to her in hand paid or secured to be paid by the said Reffus Hart at or before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Sally Brister doth hereby acknowledge have bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said Reffus Hart his heirs and assigns apart of that tract of land known as the John Brister deceased bought of Joseph Sumner and lying in the County of Southampton containing by a late survey sixty seven and a half acres be the same more or less and bounded in the following manner to wit Beginning in a small branch at a black gum in swampy place Chesler and running up the said branch a line of marked trees & a poplar in the line of said branch South 36° E. 20 poles thence S 80° E. 36 poles to a Dogwood a Grape tree thence S 83° E. 32 poles to a little pine a more corner in old field thence S 48° E. 48 poles to a little pine black gum a more corner to a small white oak at 47 10 32 poles thence along his line S 53° 45 55 poles to a large red oak thence S 70° 10 14 poles to a Hickory a corner of Warner and Stephenson thence Stephenson line S 11° 17 50 poles to a Spanish oak thence at 15 64 17 poles to a Chest oak thence S 11° 53 poles to a red oak a corner in Stephenson's line and thence at 45 67 poles to the first station together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging and the reversion and accendents remanents and remainders great and other rents issues and profits thereof To have and to hold the said tract of land with the Tenements hereditaments and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of the right manors and appurtenances unto the said Reffus Hart his heirs and assigns forever and the said Sally Brister for her self and her heirs the said land with all and singular the premises appurtenances and before mentioned unto the said Reffus Hart his heirs and assigns free from the claim of the said Sally Brister and of her heirs and of all and every person or persons whomsoever their will and agreement and forever released by these presents in witness whereof the said Sally Brister has hereunto set her hand and seal the day and year first above written

This Indenture made the twenty sixth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three between Thomas M. Butler Clerk of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Andrew Jones of the County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Thomas M. Butler and Andrew Jones for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and thirty dollars complete money of the Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Andrew Jones before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Andrew Jones doth and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said Andrew Jones his heirs and assigns a certain tract of land situated lying and being in the County of Southampton containing sixty eight and three fourths of an acre and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a red oak a corner of Southampton and Lane Land thence along the said Lane line to a corner in Little Necklesham's line thence along the corner of said Necklesham's line to a corner in Benjamin Applewhite's line thence along the said Applewhite's line to a corner in Henry Applewhite's line thence along the said Applewhite's line to the aforesaid West look's line thence along the said line to the beginning
