This Indenture made and entered into this 22nd day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three between Edmund Brown and James his wife of the County of Northampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Sape Turner of the County of said State of one of the other part. Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand and twenty dollars and fifty cents to me in hand paid by the said Sape Turner the receipt whereof he do hereby acknowledge as full payment and satisfaction hath bargained sold and delivered unto the said Sape Turner one certain tract or parcel of land situated lying & being in the County of Northampton on the west side of the flat swamp containing by late survey thirty and eight acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows Beginning at a corner Black Oak in Station Turners line running North 75° East - 55 poles to the centre of a pine and white oak in Benjamin Turners line thence North 5° E 60 1/2 poles to a red oak thence North 21° E 38 poles to a corner pine near the mouth of the said thence South 5° East 48 poles to 2 small red oaks in the land thence down the East 50 poles to the first Station in Turners and to hold all the appurtenances thereof from and after the sealing and delivery hereof in actual possession and enjoyment by force and virtue of these presents unto the said Sape Turner his heirs his assigns forever to him and their proper heirs and assigns in as large an affinity as may be enjoyed by the said Edmund Brown and wife or any other persons or persons might or would enjoy claiming under us. In the course of the 24th April 1823 John Edwards was called by Edmund Dromy and together with the Antislavery Clerical and other agents of the Anti-Slavery Society, examined of Henry Dromy, wife of J. Dromy, partner in the firm of Dromy and Co. and she answered for the purpose of the 15th May 1823. The Antislavery Clerical and other agents were called upon the proceedings of the day.
