This Indenture made the 22nd day of February 1832 between Benjamin Whithead and daughter wife of the County
of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part and Benjamin Buggins of the County of S. to Lupton and State
aforesaid of the other second part and Eum Ely of the County of S. to Lupton and State of Virginia of the third
part makes known and attest that whereas the said Benjamin Whithead and daughter wife is indebted to the said
Benjamin Buggins in the sum of three hundred and sixty seven dollars and fifty cents double money of Virginia
with interest entered from the date which the said Benjamin Whithead and daughter wife is indebted to the said
Benjamin Buggins to the said Benjamin Buggins This Indenture therefore witnesseth that for and in considera-
tion of the premises as also for and to the said Benjamin Whithead and daughter wife paid by the said
Benjamin Buggins and Eum Ely the sum of a barely account large have bargained and sold and by these presents do
bargain and sell unto the said Benjamin Buggins and Eum Ely their heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or
parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by estimation about fifty ten and a half
acres in the same more or less and bounded by the lands of John Stephens Leslie Sanders James Clayton John
Lowe and Benjamin Porter &c and the following other property to wit one Parcel here two parties had and purchased
one East and where one East thirty head of hogs eight head of sheep one heifer one sow and four three tubs
Three chest Eight setting chairs four two trays three iron one Apple mill (mills six empty) hogs head two
five cedar barrels three one four plough one half dozen Porter plates ten earthen plates four further four
two porter dishes one dozen pewee spoons also all the crops of corn fodder peas and ground which may
be made on the before mentioned tract of Land this present year. To have and to hold the said
Tract of Land with its appurtenances and other property unto the said Benjamin Buggins and
