of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said Washington hath granted bargained and sold and by these
presents doth grant bargain sell convey and confirm unto the said Abraham Denson and to his heirs and assigns forever one certain
tract or parcel of Land lying and situate on the South of French Branch and adjoining the land of Anthony Anderson and Henry
Hartman and bounded as follows Beginning at a Stake on an ancient line and corner in said State line then said State line
is a large Maple on and near the deep branch a corner thence southerly to the fence at Warleys orchard is called thence along that
orchard fence westerly to the corner near the head of a ditch thence along the said ditch southerly to a small branch then
the same corner continued to said Andersons line and thence along this line to the beginning containing by estimation thirty
five acres to the same mine or up to have said to hold the said tract or parcel of land to him the said Abraham Denson
