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This Indenture made this 12th day of February in the year of our Lord aforesaid one thousand eight hundred and twenty two between Joseph Wick and Dorothy his wife all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Edwin Wick of the same County and State of Virginia of the other part: Witnesseth that the said Joseph Wick and Dorothy his wife for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars good money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Edwin Wick the receipt whereof the said Joseph Wick and wife Dorothy doth acknowledge themselves fully and amply satisfied and paid hath granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents hath granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed unto the said Edwin Wick to him and to his heirs forever one certain tract or parcel of Land and premises containing by a late survey one thousand twenty three & 1/4 acres be the same more or less situated lying and being in the County of Southampton and State aforesaid and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a Pine at the road near the ^{Bridge} Caswell's Swamp in Edwin Wick's land thence the said Road northward to the said Edwin Wick's line to Joseph Brown Orphan's line thence said Brown's line to the center of the abate Pond thence the various courses of said abate Pond and said Edwin Wick's line to the first Station also another tract of Land of Seventy five acres be the same more or less which was Nancy Parsh's dower right and bounded by the common fences neighborly together with all houses out houses edifices buildings yard Gardens orchard ways mazes and lesser courses whatever belonging or on any case appurtenant to the said Tracts of Land. To have and to hold the same unto the said Edwin Wick to him and to his heirs forever and the said Joseph Wick and wife Dorothy for themselves their heirs Executors administrators and assigns with by their present covenant and grants to and with the said Edwin Wick his heirs and assigns that they will by their persons servants and defend all right title claim or demand of any person or persons claiming or demanding the same or any part or parcel thereof.
