the one part and Edwin Vick of the same County and State of Virginia of the other part; witnesseth that the said  
Joseph Vick and Dorothy his wife for an consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars good money of Virginia  
to him in hand paid by the said Edwin Vick the receipt whereof the said Joseph Vick and wife Dorothy doth acknowledge  
themselves fully and amply satisfied and paid full grants bargains sell almsies unfeoffed and confirmed and by these  
present grants bargains sell almsies unfeoffed and confirmed unto the said Edwin Vick to have and to hold  
forever one certain tract or parcel of Land and premises containing by a late survey one hundred thirty three & <sup>1/2</sup> acres  
to the same more or less situate lying and being in the County of Southampton and that aforesaid land bounded  
as follows: First Beginning at a Tree at the road near the Currant <sup>Bridge</sup> Road in Edwin Vick's line thence the said  
Road through said Vick's line thence said Vick's line to Joseph Brong Orphans line thence said Brong line to the
