This Indenture made this 17<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year of our Lord Christ One thousand Eight hundred and twenty three between John J. Blon and Thomas Dwyburgh Esq<sup>r</sup> of the Nation of the Indians of the one part and Maria Burdall wife of Isaac Burdall who was deceased before her daughter of Thomas Burdall deceased of the County of Southampton of the other part witnesseth that whereas by an act of the General Assembly passed the 25<sup>th</sup> day of January 1782 intituled an act authorizing that

the Settlement Title of Indians to lands certain herein mentioned it was enacted among other things that the said Trustees or any two of them Convey by deed to the said Burdall or his heirs a tract of Land lying in the County of Southampton and soys by the former Trustees of the said Tribe of Indians by virtue of an act passed the 13<sup>th</sup> day of November One thousand Seven hundred and Ninety five Entituled an act Enormising the Settlement Title of Indians after this Indenture further to establish that for and in consideration of the circumstances aforesaid as well as for and by virtue of the full first act of Assembly the parties of the first part to these presents and as Trustees aforesaid have made hereunto and do by this present give grant Bargain and Convey unto the said Marritt Burdall of the County of Southampton the aforesaid tract of Land for this that whereas by virtue and in pursuance of the Act of Assembly aforesaid passed the 13<sup>th</sup> day of November 1792 the Trustees of the said Tribe of Indians do to the above mentioned Thomas Burdall the tract of Land within mentioned but never Conveyed to him to him by deed of Conveyance nor by virtue and in pursuance of the aforesaid Trustees Act of Assembly the former Trustees of the said Tribe of Indians have granted Conveyed and do by these presents grant Bargain unto the said Marritt Burdall (whos heirs) the aforesaid tract of Land which was purchased by his Father Thomas Wetherow of the former Trustees of the Settlement Tribe of Indians and by them sold under the aforesaid Act of Assembly passed the 13<sup>th</sup> day of November 1792 Containing by estimation three hundred and sixty five acres lie the same more or less lying in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows. First Beginning at a Chestnut Coppice and an Elm by the side of Stich Nicholson Mill pond not far from this settle said Nicholson lies three rods long E 6 1/2 rods to a small pine bush corner A 30 1/2 E 15 1/2 rods to corner bogland in Thomas Dwyburghs Pine thence the line A 88 E 18 rods to fur and aft Hickory tree E 9 1/2 E 16 1/2 rods to fur and aft pine thence the same course E 9 rods to Ellow tree and S 55 1/2 E 15 1/2 E 4 1/2 rods to aft end take fork of Path E 83 1/2 E 28 rods to a corner pine for John J. Reddick thence the line South E 15 1/2 rods to a fore left Red oak S 28 1/2 E 14 1/2 rods to a small red oak corner for Hammett 19 rods to thence the line S 7 1/2 E 55 1/2 rods to a fore and aft white oak S 16 1/2 E 10 1/2 rods to another for and aft white oak S 13 1/2 M 29 rods to a side line Black Gum S 17 1/2 W 25 rods to Hickey oak S 11 1/2 W 29 rods to corner Black gum and thence N 22 rods to a fore and aft white oak S 9 1/2 N 12 rods N 25 M 20 rods to corner Black gum in small branch thence down the meandering of that river to its junction with Orskey Branch thence down the meanderings of the river of Orskey Branch to its junction with Buckhorn Swamp at a small ash thence down the river of the Buckhorn Swamp to a hickory oak at the edge of the river from as in dock said river Black line thence along the edge of the low ground down to Black River swamp to the mouth of the Orskey Branch thence down the various courses of the edge of the low ground to the High Water mark of said Buckhorn Swamp to the mouth of the Colie River thence down to the main river of said swamp to when the beginning line extends back to the river more intersected it turns to the river began at the place and to set the aforesaid tract of land with the appurtenances thereto belonging to the said Marritt Burdall and his heirs to the only proper use and service of the said Marritt Burdall his heirs and assigns forever And the said General Coll. John J. Blon and Thomas Dwyburgh forthwith their heirs executors and administrators each of them hereby conveys and agrees to and with the said Marritt Burdall for fees and charges that they the said General Coll. John J. Blon and Thomas Dwyburgh & others executors as trustees as well their heirs the said tract of land with its appurtenances in fee simple to the said Marritt Burdall for fees and charges against themselves the said General Coll. John J. Blon and Thomas Dwyburgh as trustees and their successors as trustees of the now said Tribe of Indians and against all persons who may ever claim by survey or otherwise
