This Indenture made the 17<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year of our Lord Christ One thousand Eight hundred & 35  
And twenty three between Benjamin Bordale Esq. John J. Blon and Thomas Fitzhugh Esq. of the Trustee of the Indians  
Trib of Indians of the one part and Harriet Wendale wife of Isaac Wendale who was daughter of the said  
daughter of Thomas Westbrooke dec<sup>d</sup> of the County of Southampton of the other part Witnesseth that whereas  
by an act of the General Assembly passed the 20<sup>th</sup> day of January 1732 Intituled an act authorizing the trustees  
of the Stationary Title of Indians to convey certain lands therein mentioned It was enacted among other things  
that the said trustees or any three of them Convey by deed to the said Harriet Wendale or her heirs a tract  
of Land lying in the County of Southampton and situate by the former trustees of the said Title of Indians  
by virtue of an act passed the 13<sup>th</sup> day of November One thousand seven hundred and twenty five entitled  
an act concerning the Stationary Title of Indians Act. This Indenture further witnesseth that for and in  
consideration of the Assurances aforesaid as well as for and by virtue of the said Statute act of  
Assembly on the premises of the first part to these presents and as trustees aforesaid have granted bargain  
and do by these presents give grant bargain and convey unto the said Harriet Wendale of the County of York  
(formerly Harriet Wendale the aforesaid tract of Land for and that whereas by virtue and by virtue of the  
act of Assembly aforesaid passed the 13<sup>th</sup> day of November 1732 the trustees of the said Title of Indians do to  
the above mentioned Thomas Westbrooke the tract of Land within mentioned that now conveyed to him  
to him by deed of Conveyance Act. In pursuance of the aforesaid Statute Act of Assembly the said  
Trustee of the said Title of Indians have granted Conveyed and do by these presents grant bargain  
unto the said Harriet Wendale (or her heirs) the aforesaid tract of Land which was purchased  
by Sir Walter Thomas Westbrooke of the former Trustee of the Stationary Title of Indians and do  
by these presents under the aforesaid act of Assembly passed the 13<sup>th</sup> day of November 1732 contain  
ing by estimation three hundred and sixty five acres be the same more or less lying and being in  
the County of Southampton and bounded as follows. To wit Beginning at a Chopin Cypress and on  
down by the side of Rich Nicholas mile ponds not far from said where in said Nicholas line there  
the line E 1/4 S 1/4 pole to a small pine bush corner N 30 E 15 7/8 pole to corner. Begon in  
Thomas Fitzhugh's line thence the line N 88 E 18 pole to fore and aft Hickory 8 1/2 pole to fore  
and aft pine thence the same course 19 pole to Elbow Red oak S 53 pole S 13 E 48 1/2 pole to  
aft red oak fork of Bush S 53 1/2 E 28 pole to a corner. pine for John J. Richard and thence the  
line South 15 1/4 N 29 pole to a fore raft Red oak S 25 1/2 E 14 1/2 pole to a small red oak corner  
for Thomas Westbrooke thence the line S 7 W 55 1/2 pole to a fore and aft white oak S 16 1/2 E 18 1/2 pole  
to another fore and aft white oak S 18 1/4 N 29 pole to a side line Black Gum S 17 1/2 E 25 pole to  
black oak S 15 1/2 E 29 pole to corner. Black Gum S 17 1/2 E 25 pole to a fore and aft white oak S 18 1/4  
N 29 pole to corner. Black Gum S 17 1/2 E 25 pole to a fore and aft white oak S 18 1/4 N 29 pole to  
its junction with Oakley branch thence down the meandering of the run of Oakley branch to its junction  
with the bottom branch at a small ash thence down the run of the bottom branch to a white oak on the  
edge of the low ground in said bottom branch line thence along the edge of the low ground down the  
black horn swamp to the mouth of the Spring branch thence down the meandering of the edge of the low  
ground to the high water mark of said bottom branch is the mouth of the Cabin branch thence down the  
main run of said swamp to the beginning line continue back to the same main interest at which the  
line began at to have and to hold the aforesaid tract of Land with the appurtenances thereto belonging  
for the said Harriet Wendale and her heirs to the only proper use and behoof of the said Harriet Wendale  
her heirs and assigns forever And the said Benjamin Bordale John J. Blon and Thomas Fitzhugh Esq. do  
then their heirs and assigns do each of them hereby Covenant and agree to and with the said Harriet  
Wendale her heirs and assigns that they the said Benjamin Bordale John J. Blon and Thomas Fitzhugh  
or their successors as trustees or with their heirs the said tract of Land with its appurtenances and  
then the said Harriet Wendale her heirs and assigns against their heirs the said Benjamin Bordale  
John J. Blon and Thomas Fitzhugh as trustees and their successors as trustees of the Stationary  
Title of Indians and against all persons whatsoever claiming by bargain or under title
