Wit know to all whom it may concern that by the last will and testament of Joseph Ruffin deceased bearing date the 25<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year of our Lord 1783 proved and recorded in the County Court of Southampton and state of Virginia it is therein directed that Charles a Negro man then a slave to the said Joseph Ruffin be set free and forever discharged from bondage as a slave and that he may henceforth pass and be treated as a free man; And whereas by the said will the undersigned John Marshall & Joshua Scott were constituted and appointed Executors to the said Joseph Ruffin and upon former The duties therein required have considered it inconvenient on them and they do hereby renounce and forswear to act for himself as he may be disposed the said Negro man Charles relinquishing at the same time all right title and claim to him and whatsoever property he may heretofore acquired by testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands and affix our seals this 25<sup>th</sup> of October in the year 1820

This Indenture made this 27<sup>th</sup> day of May in the year of our English hundred and twenty three thousand Nathan Grey of Southampton County and state of Virginia of the one part and Arthur Williamson of the said County and state of the other part witnesseth that the said Nathan Grey for and consideration of the sum of six hundred and sixty dollars in hand paid by the said Arthur Williamson at or before the executing and delivery of the present receipt whereof is hereunto fully acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents to say Arthur Williamson his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land there lying and being in the County of Southampton containing one hundred and thirty acres to be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit on the north by the three creeks on the east west and south by the land of the late James Blair deceased it being the land Nathan Grey part of his father Phillip Grey's land to have and to hold the said aforesaid land with all the appurtenances thereto or in any wise appertaining and all the privileges to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Arthur Williamson his heirs and assigns forever and the said Nathan Grey for himself and his heirs doth hereby convey said land with all right and title and with all and singular the premises and appurtenances thereunto unto the said Arthur Williamson his heirs and assigns free from the claims of him the said Nathan Grey or his heirs and of all and of every person or persons whatsoever shall hold and do warrant and recover by these presents In witness whereof the said Nathan Grey have hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal this day and year first written

This Indenture made and entered into the 13<sup>th</sup> day of July eighteen hundred and forty three between them as to Ione and Martha Edwards wife of the one part and Elias Edwards of the other part witnesseth that the said Thomas C. Jones and Martha Edwards his wife have for and consideration of one thousand dollars current money of Virginia in hand paid by the said Elias Edwards to the executors and admiral of their presents bargained and sold and by these presents as bargains and all unto the said Elias Edwards his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land containing one hundred and fifty acres being the same wherein the said Thomas C. Jones at present resides and bounded by the lands of Willis Griffee Edwards late wife of Elias Edwards and James Brown adjoining together with the riverine and common boundaries
