This Indenture made this 22nd day of July in the year of Christ Eighteen hundred and twenty three
 Nathaniel Young and Mary his wife of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia of the one part and James
 Williams of the County of Southampton in the State aforesaid of the other part Witness by writing of an act of
 Congress passed the 9th day of January 1805 entitled an act to provide additional revenue for defraying the expenses
 of Government and maintaining the public Credit by laying a direct tax upon the United States and to provide for the
 collecting and apportioning the same the part of said law after mentioned lying and being in the County of South-
 ampton was duly applied in the name of Elizabeth Williams as the owner thereof and by the said of the
 sum of ninety four Cents was imposed as a tax thereon for one year under the said Act of Congress and when
 the said owner of the said land was not a resident of the said County of Southampton nor more the said tax
 paid and whereas the said taxes on the said land remained unpaid for one year after notice taken there-
 by made William D Taylor the designated Collector did on the 12 day of July in the year Eighteen
 hundred and nineteen at the Eagle Hotel in the City of Richmond offer at public sale the said land
 and the said Nathaniel Young became the purchaser of the said land containing sixty acres the
 of an acre then this Indenture witnessed that the said Nathaniel Young and Mary his wife for
 consideration of sixty dollars good and lawful money of Virginia to him the said Nathaniel Young
 hand paid by the said James Williams before the execution of this Indenture the receipt whereof is
 acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell and
 convey unto the said James Williams his heirs and assigns the aforesaid tract of sixty acres of land
 adjoining Oliver Nicks lying in the said County of Southampton and its appurtenances and all
 and singular thereof title interest claim and demand which the said Young has thereto and to the
 Nathaniel Young and Mary his wife do hereby Covenant to and with the said James Williams
 warrant the said land against the title claim and demand of them the said Young and wife
 all other persons claiming under them forever. In witness whereof the said Nathaniel Young and
 Mary his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and date first herein
