Jones for himself his heirs executors or assigns doth by these presents covenant to grant to the said Richard Hines shall think proper after giving ten days legal notice by advertisement of the day and place of sale set up at Publick Auction the property aforesaid to the highest bidder and sell the same for the best price which can be obtained for cash and the money arising from said sale first to satisfy and pay all reasonable expenses attending such sale and to pay and satisfy the debt and interest as within mentioned and the residue and surplus money of any there should be to pay over to the said Edward M. Jones his heirs executors or assigns or to some person or persons as he shall appoint to receive the same in trust for him or to some person who shall be entitled by law in the distribution of his intestate Estate for wants whereby the said Edward M.
