This Indenture made this day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and twenty three between Robert Picks Jr. of the one part and Edwin Picks of the other & James H. Tucker part both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to the said Robert Picks Jr. in hand paid the receipt whereof the day of our Lord (hereby) acknowledge hath given grants long past due and Conveyed And by these presents doth give 1823 A. M. grant Long past due and Convey unto the said Edwin Picks a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton and on the north side of Settlement River containing by estimation now hundred and fifty acres to the same more or less seven hundred and fifty two acres (part thereof but to the same more or less) being the tract of land wherein the said Edwin Picks now resides which Land was granted to Henry Bonner by patent bearing date the 15<sup>th</sup> of March 1755 and sold and Conveyed by the Executors of the said Henry Bonner to a certain Thomas Collier in pursuance to the testament and last will of Henry Bonner which said will bears date the 16<sup>th</sup> of August 1757 and is recorded in the County Court of Southampton references being had thereto the same will fully appears and was afterwards sold by the Executors of the said Thomas Collier in pursuance of the testament and last will of the said Thomas to a certain Iephtha Whitchurch who first the said Iephtha Whitchurch in possession thereof but before the said deed of Conveyance could be executed the said Iephtha departed this life intestate and without issue by means whereof the title of the said Land descended to Arthur Whitchurch who was the eldest brother and heir at law of the whole family of the said Iephtha Whitchurch by reason whereof a deed of Conveyance was made to the said Arthur on the 9<sup>th</sup> of December 1784 which is also of record in the County Court of Southampton and was by the said Arthur sold to William Whitchurch by deed bearing date the 10<sup>th</sup> day of December 1784 and affirmed me by the said William Whitchurch sold I Conveyed in Trust to John Warren Nicholas Magott Arthur Whitchurch and James Wilkinson to secure a certain sum of money due the Estate of the said Thomas as Balance by deed bearing date the 17<sup>th</sup> December 1784 which is also of record in the County Court of Southampton and was by the trustees in pursuance of that trust sold & Conveyed to
