

Thomas Edmunds by and bearing date the 15<sup>th</sup> August 1791 which is also of record in Southampton County Court Reference being had to the said several titles and deeds the names and times of sale & c. to a. said 783 acres of Land herein mentioned were as part of the said Minotumaron and fifty three acres severally sold and Conveyed unto James and at Large Appman another piece and parcel Containing 170 acres to the same more or less and being part of the said 953 acres herein first mentioned was purchased by Thomas Edmunds in his day time of Miles Scarborough by David Learmonth date the 17<sup>th</sup> October 1790 and is also of record in the said County Court of Southampton Reference being had thereto the Lands will fully appear the aforesaid two pieces parcels both Plantations and Meadways of Land together containing Nine hundred and fifty three acres to the same more or less was sold and granted by the said Thomas Edmunds in his day time to his son Edmund Edmunds by his son Edmund to Robert Ricks Jr. on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of April 1803 which is of record in the Clerks office of the County Court of Southampton 783 acres part thereof is bounded and described in this deed as following by the River of the Nason and Indians formerly now Alexander. In that Coguanhamo River flowing by the Lands of Henry Allens Brdmain Scarborough and Moody Collier the river being branched the one branch running down to the Tidway River the other piece Containing 170 acres more or less is bounded as follows beginning at a lightning tree on the North side of Coguanhamo formerly a corner of William Johnsons then North to a pine thence to a live oak thence to a red oak thence to a black oak a corner of William Scarborough pine thence that pine to a black oak thence to a gun in the Coguanhamo flowing down the river to the beginning also I give grant Bargain and Sale unto the said Edwin the following negro slaves to wit Jaymes Wicks, Lucy Wilson, Peter Sixty, Kelly Elsey, Maria and Phillips & two and to hold the said Land above mentioned containing Nine hundred and fifty three acres more or less with all and Singular the appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise appertaining together with its above named Slaves and their future increase to them and his heirs forever to the very proper use and behoof of him the said Edwin Ricks his Heirs and assigns forever and the said Robert Ricks Jr. for himself and his heirs the said tract or parcel of Land and premises and the said negro slaves before mentioned against himself his heirs &c and against all and every other person persons whatsoever to the said Edwin Ricks his heirs and assigns shall and will warrant and defend by these presents an action whereof I have renunciate set my hand this the day above written first.
