there by and delivered by these presents and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said Lydia
Beal her heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land to contain ten acres to be cut off from the
tract wherein the said Jacob Beal now resides Commencing at an oak tree on the bounds of Jordan Edwards
and the said Jacob Beal thence along Archibald Johnsons line to a pine tree on the lands of said Jacob and before
and after the same on Johnsons line thence nearly due East direction sufficiently far to include ten acres beginning
from the termination of the said East line nearly due East to Jordan Edwards line and thence to the
first station to have and to hold the said land with the tenement hereditaments and appurtenances &
all and singular the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold unto the said
Lydia Beal her heirs and assigns forever and the said Jacob Beal and Peggy his wife as for themselves and their
heirs man and wife said premises against them or either of their claim or either of their heirs or devisees

Robert A. Rodgers and wife Lucy G. Rodgers of the County of Southampton of the one part and John Broth of the County of the other
witnesseth that returning the said Robert A. Rodgers and his wife Lucy G. Rodgers for and in consideration of the sum
of no hundred dollars in hand paid by John Broth at an before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt
whereof the said Robert A. Rodgers doth hereby acknowledge to the Robert A. Rodgers hath grants bargained and sold
this 21st day of June 1823 and confirmed and by these presents for themselves their heirs and assigns do grant bargain and sell all
of furnish and confirm unto the said Jno Broth his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land containing
forty five acres more or less lying and being in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows to wit beginning
at a Tree on William T. Morris line then along the said Morris line to a grom in the long March thence up the said
Groom to a small grom a corner of Eason Davis line thence to a corner next thence to a Post oak in Wm. Morris line
thence along the said Wm. Morris line to a pine a corner of the Davis line thence along the said the Davis line to a corner
post shrub along the said Davis line to a small red oak in Miles Weston line thence along the said Weston line to the
beginning and remainders remanents remainder and remains of this said Land and premises all
