This Indenture made and entered into this 13<sup>th</sup> day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three and between John Thomas of Southampton County, Esq; of the one part and Somers Myrick of the same County and State of the same part witnesseth That the said John Thomas and the said Somers Myrick have swapped our acre of Land lying and lying in the aforesaid County and State and in the lower district of Saint Leket Earth the aforesaid the said Thomas to the said Myrick is an acre which the said Thomas purchased of the Rockelle which into more fully appear by a Bill executed by Rockelle & Ann his wife and son John in the clerks office in the aforesaid County & being a part of a tract of Land which the said Rockelle purchased of a certain Elington & Brown it is nevertheless understood that there is land in the above acre which the said Thomas reserves to himself to move off of the acre which he said Thomas is to do between this and the 1<sup>st</sup> day of March 1824 and the said Myrick do by these presents to the said Thomas one half acre lying in the down of Stoney bounded by Dark Street a lot less by Rockelle to the Melch. Mr. Mayott's lot and Foster Williams lot and the rest two acreage lands in the rest of his land as Lot No 10 also one half acre Lot No 25 and bounded by Washes, High Street Rockelle Alley & Lot No 26. Now the above parties do each of them bind themselves to him selves to stand and abide the above agreement on the above swapped Land or lots of Ground & without which the parties have set out hands and found our scale this day and year above written.

This Indenture made this 28<sup>th</sup> day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three between Mynck of the County of Suffolk the one part and James Selwyn of the other part witnesseth That the said Mynck by virtue of his Deed of Trust executed to him by the Prince and others for the purpose of securing the payment of a certain sum of money mentioned to William P. Rodney having date the ninth day of December one thousand eight hundred and twenty two recorded in the clerks office of the County Court of Suffolk for and consideration of the sum of Eighty nine dollars and thirty seven cents to him now paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and granted by the said James Selwyn to him and his heirs and executors forever all the right title interest claim or demand of John Prince of us and to a certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by estimation being there acre by the same more or less and bounded by the Land of Elizabeth Prince William Prince and the Lands of the said James Selwyn to have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land unto the said James Selwyn his heirs and executors and the said Mynck for himself and his heirs all the title to the said Land which was granted to him by the before mentioned Deed of Trust free from the claim or demand of the said Charles Myrick and of all and every person or persons claiming under him unto the said James Selwyn his heirs and executors and will warrant and forever defend by these presents In witness whereof the said Charles Myrick hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year first above written.
