This Indenture made on the 20th day of March in the year anno domini one thousand eight hundred and five between Simmon Butte and Elizabeth his wife of the County of Southampton of the part and Daniel Butte of the aforesaid County of the other part witnesseth that the said Simmon Butte and his wife for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred dollars to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is here by acknowledged have given granted bargained and sold and by these presents do give grant bargains and sell unto the said Daniel Butte and his heirs our certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton and parish of Newmarket containing by survey fifty nine and three fifths acres to the same mind and esp beginning at a pine on a small branch in John Howlins a corner of Francis Clements and the said land runs running \$10 10 10 feet to a tree at corner of the said Clements John James and the said land thence \$15 6 8 poles to a white oak then \$12 6 8 poles to a dead pine at corner of John James John Morris and the said land thence \$10 10 10 poles to the beginning to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land together with its appurtenances to him the said Daniel Butte and his heirs forever and the said Simmon Butte his wife Elizabeth and their heirs executors administrators &c the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances to him the said Daniel Butte his heirs and assigns shall and will forever remain and depend in arrears whereof the said Simmon Butte and his wife Elizabeth have herunto set their hands and seals the day and year above written signed sealed and delivered in presence of
