This Indenture made on the 30th day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and five between Simon Butte and Elizabeth his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and Daniel Butte of the aforesaid County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Simon Butte and his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have given granted bargained and sold and by these presents do give grant bargain and sell unto the said Daniel Butte and his heirs one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton and parish of Matiney Containing by survey fifty nine and three fifths acres be the same more or less beginning at a pine on a small branch in John Hunslow's corner of Francis Clements and the said land and running S 10° 15' E 120 feet to a pine in a corner of the said Clements John James and the said land thence S 55° E 84 feet to a white oak then N 43° E 75 feet to a dead pine in corner of John James John Hunslow and the said land thence N 40° W 100 feet to the beginning. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land together with its appurtenances to him the said Daniel Butte and his heirs forever and the said Simon Butte his wife Elizabeth and their heirs executors administrators of the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances to him the said Daniel Butte his heirs and assigns shall and lawfully may and defend in witness whereof the said Simon Butte and his wife Elizabeth have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year above written signed sealed and delivered in presence of
