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This Indentured made on the 20th day of March in the year above written between Simonne Watts and Elizabeth his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and Daniel Watts of the other part Witnesseth that the said Simonne Watts and his wife Elizabeth for & in consideration of the sum of ten hundred dollars to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have given granted bargained and sold unto the said Daniel Watts and his heirs our certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton and parish of Medbury containing by survey one hundred and eleven and one half acres be the same more or less beginning at a pine stump on Richard Hodgkins land a corner of a plantation belonging to the said Daniel Watts and the said Land beginning at a pine stump a corner of the said Richard Hodgkins land and the said land thence N 15 E 150 poles to a dead pine then N 30 W 100 poles to a white oak then N 12 pole to a red oak a corner of Williams land and the said land thence N 15 E 150 poles to a red oak a corner of the said Williams and the said land thence S 15 E 100 poles to the beginning To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land together with its appurtenances to him the said Daniel Watts and his heirs forever and the said Simonne Watts his wife Elizabeth and their heirs forever &c. the said tract or parcel of Land with its appurtenances to him the said Daniel Watts his heirs and assigns shall & lawfully warrant and defend in return whereof the said Simonne Watts and Elizabeth his wife have bounden their heirs and assigns the day and year above written

This Indenture made this 15 day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three between Robert Maudslowe of Southampton County of the one part and John Sykes of the County of Sussex of the other part Witnesseth that the said Robert Maudslowe for and in consideration of five hundred dollars of lawful money of this Commonwealth to him in hand paid by the said John Sykes at or before the making and delivery of these presents (the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged) have bargained and sold unto the said John Sykes his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land containing by estimation one hundred acres lying and being in Southampton County bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at a post oak in the canopy branch in North Charlborough line thence along the said line to a perpendicular two chains it is or is not thence along the said line to David Townsend line thence along said line to a short gum thence to a red oak thence to a black gum thence along said Townsend line to the above mentioned canopy branch thence up the said course of said branch to the beginning together with all houses and out houses and all other buildings thereunto belonging or in any way appertaining to have & to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances therunto belonging to the said John Sykes his heirs assigns forever to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said John Sykes his heirs and assigns forever And the said Robert Maudslowe for himself and his heirs the said one hundred acres land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said John Sykes his heirs and assigns free from all claims or claims of him the said Robert Maudslowe himself or either of his heirs and assigns except alienors or persons whatsoever that will and do consent and forebear defend by these presents In witness whereof the said Robert Maudslowe have hereunto set his hand and done the day and year first above written.
