This Indenture made this the 17th day of June in the year of our Lord 1822, between William Norrison and Ann his wife of the County of Southampton and in the State of Virginia of the one part and Cornell Wick junior of the other part witnesseth that the said William Norrison and Ann his wife for and in consideration of the sum of sixteen dollars and thirty three cents of gold and ten full moneys of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Cornell Wick senior before the sealing and delivery of this present receipt which is forty shillings hath hitherto bargained and sold over by these presents unto the said William Norrison and Ann his wife certain unpaide tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the County of Essex containing by estimation thereon a gross to the same more or less bounded as follows to wit beginning at a Maple standing in the middle branch a corner of land the said Cornell Wick senior by a line of marks runs northward westward to a small stream in said Bayou and thence westward to a right hand post or sign whereon the same may be set and marked and from thence northward to a small fence in the run of the above said branch thence into the various corners of the run of said branch to the beginning to have and to hold the aforesaid land and premises together with all houses and buildings thereon now existing or to be erected and all other the profits thereof and to have and to hold the said tract of land and every part and parcel thereof unto the said Cornell Wick senior his heirs and assigns forever and the said William Norrison and Ann his wife to him and her assigns shall and may at all times hereafter defend and keep the said tract of land with all its appurtenances unto the said Cornell Wick senior his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of all other every person or persons whatsoever with whom and from whom he or she or any of them may have been concerned and from whomsoever he or she or any of them may have been derived or given and to pay all taxes and charges of interest and estate in fee simple forever unto him the said Cornell Wick senior his heirs and assigns forever to satisfy and discharge the aforesaid William Norrison and Ann his wife both hereunto set their hands to these presents this day and year first above written.

To This Indenture made and entered into this 27th day of July 1823 between Elias Edwards of the first part and James Rockwell of the second part on the 1st May last of the third part Whereas the said Elias Edwards is partly indebted to the said James Rockwell in the sum of three hundred and sixteen dollars and fifty cents due by him on his bearing date with these presents and due the 25th instant and the said Elias Edwards being willing and desirous of discharging the payment of the same for the Indenture aforesaid that for an consideration of the premises and the further Consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said James Rockwell unto the said Elias Edwards he the said Elias Edwards hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said James Rockwell his heirs and assigns forever and certain tract or parcel of land containing one hundred and fifty acres being the same recently purchased of Thomas & Jones together with the reversion and incident remainder and reversionary with the yearly and other rents of and profits and every part and parcel thereof to have and to hold the said land with the aforesaid boundaries and all and singular the premises and appurtenances theron before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold unto him the said James Rockwell his heirs and assigns forever upon trust nevertheless that the said Jas Rockwell shall permit the said Elias Edwards to hold and enjoy the said land until default in non payment of said debt and then upon the further trust that as soon thereafter as the
