This Indenture made this 17 day of October in the year of our Lord 1823 between Aa Neal and Thelie
 his wife of the one part and William Norton of the other part and all of Southampton County and State of Va
 Witnesseth that the said Aa Neal and Thelie his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty four Dollars
 (Twenty four full money) of Virginia to them hereunto paid at or before the making and delivery of these presents the
 receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged they the said Aa Neal and Thelie his wife do hereby give sell and let
 over to the said William Norton or certain let or mortgage of land lying and being situate
 in the aforesaid County of Southampton they the said Aa Neal and Thelie his wife do sell &
 convey the same lot of land to the said William Norton a being a part of the land that said
 Neal inherited from her father Ego Johnson and bounded as follows to wit beginning at the
 roady branch and in the road that leads from James Trollet to William Norton joining the
 said Trollet land then running up the branch to a fence joining William Norton land
 then running to the left to a Cedar tree from thence going down a road to Thomas Road
 and up the path near to John Storry then thence going Storry then to a horse apple tree in
 Storry yard from thence to the road near the roady branch thence going along the road to the
 beginning and continuing by Edmonston's line and to the same mound or up with the river
 and river's course issues and profits of the land to have the said William Norton and his
