things whatsoever concerning the premises as fully and in every respect as if I myself
might do. And as I am personally present at the doing thereof and am on oath affirms
under my hand for the purposes aforesaid to make and again at his pleasure to revoke entirely
and Conforming and by these presents attorney whatever my said attorney shall in
my name lawfully do in cause to be done in and about the premises by virtue of these
presents in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the 25th of
November 1823. signed sealed and ack'd.
