This Indenture made this seventeenth day of November Eighteen hundred and twenty three between Samuel Calvert and Margaret his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and William J. Cooke of the County of Suffolk of the other part witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars to him the said Samuel Calvert in hand paid by the said William J. Cooke before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Samuel Calvert doth hereby acknowledge have granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant Bargain & Sell unto the said William J. Cooke his heirs and assigns forever a certain piece or parcel of land situate lying and being in the County of Suffolk containing one hundred and seventy acres more or less being a part of a tract of land late by will of the said late of the County of Suffolk to the children of Rebecca J. Jeffries Commis. to the said Samuel Calvert by the M. Jeffries by exec of Recd in the Clerks office of the County of Suffolk and bounded by the lands of the said William J. Cooke which will appear by reference to a report of the Commissioners acting by virtue of a decree of the County Court of Suffolk to have and to hold the said piece or parcel of land with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging unto him the said Wm. J. Cooke his heirs and assigns forever and the said Samuel Calvert and Margaret his wife doth by these presents forever warrant and defend the title to the said premises from the claim or claims of any person or persons whatsoever In witness whereof the said Samuel Calvert and Margaret his wife have hereunto affixed their hands and seals the day and year first above written

This Indenture made the 19th day of August in the year of our Lord Christ 1823 between Elizabeth Joyner Mason Joyner and Josiey Joyner of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part John Thomas of the same County and State of the second part and John Spencer & Son of the same County and State of the third part witnesseth that whereas the said Elizabeth Joyner Martha Joyner Mason Joyner and Josiey Joyner stands pretty indebted to the said John Spencer by her bearing with date until present for one hundred and thirty three dollars three cents and also to the said John Spencer by her bearing even date with these presents for forty seven dollars and twenty two cents in the said Elizabeth Joyner Martha Joyner Mason Joyner and Josiey Joyner being actioned and desirous to be rid of the said John Spencer and John Womble in payment thereof together with the legal interest thereon accruing and also the costs of attorney's fees and attorney's fees effect these presents for this Statute sufficient that the said Elizabeth Joyner Mason
