

John Mason Syner and Lucy Syner in Consideration of the sum of one dollar to them on hand paid by the said John Thomas the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged him granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said John Thomas his heirs and assigns forever the following negroes to wit One negro woman named Syner boys Eastern Dock and Sam together with their future increase do have and hold the aforesaid four negroes with their increase as aforesaid unto him the said John Thomas his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said John Thomas his heirs and assigns forever and the said Elizabeth Syner Martha Syner Mary Syner and Jincy Syner for themselves their heirs Executors and administrators do Covenant and agree to and with the said John Thomas that they will from time and at all times forever hereafter warrant and defend the title of the aforesaid four negroes with their increase as aforesaid unto the said John Thomas his heirs and assigns forever upon special trust and Confidence nevertheless and to and for the use intents and purposes following that is to say that the said John Thomas at any time hereafter when he shall be thereto required by either of the parties make sale of the aforesaid four negroes together with their future increase at publick Auction or in any other way as will be sufficient to pay and satisfy the aforesaid debts entered and costs first going publick Justice before at least ten days of the time and place of such sale for ready money and out of the proceeds of such sale pay unto the said John Spencer and Lewis Wendell the aforesaid sum of one hundred and twenty three dollars money Count and forty seven pence seven farthings together with the growing interest thereon and the surplus of any payment to the said Elizabeth Syner Martha Syner Mary Syner and Jincy Syner or their order. This Indenture made and entered into this 17th day of November one thousand eight hundred and thirty three between John Taylor Edwards of Southampton County of the first part and James Munroe of the same County of the second and James D. Mendenburg of the same County of the third part Whereas it is shewed that the above named Taylor Edwards has indebted unto the said James Munroe according to the conditions of a promissory note and the children of him the said Taylor Edwards in the past specie sum of three hundred and fifty dollars and for which note appear by promissory note bearing equal date with these presents and made payable from the date hereof and also stands partly indebted unto him the said James Munroe for a dish to John and Lydia their orphan of William Paul and on the part and full sum of ten hundred dollars Current money which note appear by bond bearing equal date with these presents and made payable as follows To wit on made payable on the 30th of December 1833 for the sum of twelve dollars and ten thirds also and for the same sum made payable December 25th 1835 and one made payable for the same sum 25th Decr 1836 And for the Considerations of the above premises but more especially for the sum of one dollar on hand paid unto the said Taylor Edwards by him the said James D.
