This Indenture made this 17<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three Between William Ingham Esq<sup>r</sup> Jesse Sawtford and Benjamin Griffin Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Southampton to make sale of a tract of land belonging to the heirs of Captain John Courmond dec<sup>d</sup> of the one part and Gen. Barris of the other part all of the County of Southampton parts of Rutland and State of Virginia who doth that the said William Ingham Jesse Sawtford and Benjamin Griffin Commissioners as aforesaid in consideration of the sum of eleven hundred dollars (eleven hundred pounds money) to them on hand paid by the said Gen. Barris also before the writing and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is truly acknowledged here bargained and sold at full value) and by these presents do each of them bargain and sell as aforesaid unto the said Gen. Barris his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land belonging to the heirs aforesaid containing by a title deed of four hundred and ninety seven acres more or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a large pine standing over the head of a black water river thence up the various Courses of said river to a small cypress a corner of said land and thence White oaks on the banks of said river near Do be hole thence along said Whiteoak line of marked trees 859 1/2 poles 2 1/4 poles 2 5/8 poles 2 1/2 poles 2 1/4 poles and thence 2 1/2 poles to a bayonet Gum a corner of said Whiteoak and Oak Wood standing near the main run of said Gum pond thence down the run of said Gum the various Courses thereof & other courses on black water Grand Caled. Half Past Island thence along the edge of said Island 658 6/8 poles to a new line at the line thence 2 1/4 poles to a post a corner of Elizabeth Whiteoak and land standing in the pole branch thence up the said branch the various Courses thereof to dead pine standing over the edge of said pole branch a fore and aft tree in Elizabeth Whiteoak line thence along her line of marked trees 2 1/2 6/8 poles to a small spruce a corner of Elizabeth Whiteoak and said land thence 2 1/2 1/2 poles running through the grove front to the post station together with all houses edifices buildings grange Pastures orchards meadows and meads Censures together with all the pro fit Commodities advantages emoluments hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said land belonging or in any way appertaining to the same or any part or parcel thereof To have ye & hold the said four hundred and ninety seven acres of land with all and singular the premises therein before mentioned or intended to be sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights make in them as Commissioners aforesaid unto the said Gen. Barris his heirs and assigns forever (to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Gen.
