Branch after having funds required by the aforesaid John Washington shall proceed to sell the right and interest of the said John Washington to the above named property to such his land and negro Henry Conveyed or intended to be conveyed after advertising the same three weeks in the said County of Southampton for ten days previous at some publick house or store for Cash one out of the money arising out of or from the said sale in the first place pay and satisfy all costs attending the said sale as well as the expenses attending the said Conveyance and then pay off the Bond aforesaid with interest as well as all other monies which may appear to be due and owing from the said John Washington to the said Dr. M'Neckhart by means of any dealing transfer of debt or paper whatever and the surplus of any sum to the said Dr. Washington and the said Washington for himself his heirs executors and administrators the right and title of the said property herein Conveyed unto the said Lewis N. Branch his heirs and assigns forever doth hereby warrant and defend against the complete claim or claims of him the said Dr. Washington his executors and administrators against all other person or persons whatsoever And the said Lewis N. Branch on his part Covenant agrees that he will make sale of the right and interest hereby Conveyed for the best price he can obtain for the same after advertising the same and place of sale ten days previous at some publick house or store in the said County and with the money arising from the sale first pay and satisfy all costs attending the same as well as the expenses attending the Conveyance and then pay off the aforesaid bond and interest as well as all other monies which may appear to be due and owing from the said John Washington to the said John M'Neckhart by means of any dealing transfer of debt or paper whatever and then pay the overplus of any to the said John Washington and the said Lewis N.
