

This Indenture made and entered into this the first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three by and between James Bishop, Esquire, Clerk and the Officers of the County of Southampton State of Virginia of the one part and Samuel Story of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that whereas for the said James Bishop, Esquire Clerk also for the said James Bishop, Esquire Clerk and the Commissioners appointed by the most honorable County Court of said County to sell the lands of Stephen Hancock dead, which he devised to his widow Lucy during her life and in fee simple to a devise to us devise by said Court sell in manner premises it was agreed the lands specified in said devise and James and Samuel Story being the purchasers for the Commissioners do require of him the said Samuel Story such lands as was required by said devise and the said Samuel Story having complied with said terms see the Commissioners therefore for an accommodation of seven hundred and fifty six dollars and no more received of him the said Samuel Story in Bonds as required by us the said Commissioners grant bargain and sell & convey unto him the said Samuel Story all and every right or rights in us held or in any manner appertaining for us and then on him and appertain to and held by them pursuant grants bargain and sell all such right title interest or estate in said tract or parcel of lands specified in said devise containing by Estimation or some former survey one hundred acres be the same more or less to be bounded by the lands of James Story and Samuel Story on the west side by the Survey on the north east and by the said Samuel Story on the south to have and to hold the said tract and said bargain and premises with all the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any manner appertaining unto him the said Samuel Story his heirs or assigns forever. Machone of the first part James Musfus of the same part and the 1st Board of of the third part Witnesseth that whereas the said Machone having this day purchased a tract of the said Musfus was named and being therefor entitled to the said Musfus in three obligations for the amount of \$166 66 2/3 each payable on the 25th November 1824 - 5 - 6. and having devised of serving the same the said Machone incircumstances of the premises and of the sum of one hundred dollars to him in hand paid by the said Board said three obligations are said by them presents to the said Mr. 1st Board the land so by him purchased the same mentioned in a deed from Musfus to me bearing date the 25th Oct^r 1823 to him and he has from before that that he will be seen at the obligation shall become due and demand upon request of him the said Musfus or any two thereof give legal notice and tell the whole or any part of the said lands and out of the proceeds pay the amount thereof due from said Machone to said Musfus or one or more of the said obligations and the said Musfus paying agree to seen as the said demands are satisfied that he will release the premises herein above In testimony whereof the parties have hereunto set their seals this date above
