hundred and twenty three by and between James Bishop Esq^r Clerk and the Spurcer of the County of Southampton
in the State of Virginia of the one part and Samuel Story of the same County of the other part witnesseth
that whereas we the said James Bishop Esq^r Clerk also the Spurcer being Commissioners appointed by
the most honorable County Court of said County to sell the lands of Stephen Hancock deceased which he
devised to his widow Lucy during her life did in Obedience to a decree to us directed by said Court sell
in manner prescribed in said decree the lands specified in said decree and whence said Samuel Story
being the purchaser for the Commissioners doth require of him the said Samuel Story such bonds as may
be required by said decree and the said Samuel Story having Complied with said terms doth the Commissioners
therefore for and in consideration of two hundred and fifty dollars cash paid me in reward of
same the said Samuel Story in Bonds as required by the said Commissioners grant bargain and
sell of County unto him the said Samuel Story all and every right or right in or to any real
appartaining by the way or from said decree air to the said James Bishop Esq^r Clerk and the Spurcer
as aforesaid for us ourselves our heirs and assigns do and have by these presents granted bargained and sold
all such right title interest or estate in said tract or parcel of lands specified in said decree Containing
by estimation or some former Survey One hundred acres to be the same manner as to be bounded by the
lands of James Story and Samuel Story on the west side by Gloucester on the North East and by the
said Samuel Story on the south to have and to hold the said aforesaid real bargained premises with
all the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining unto him the said Samuel
Story his heirs and assigns forever In witness whereof we the above said James Bishop Esq^r Clerk

the land so by him purchased the same mentioned in a deed from the said Murfey to me bearing date the
25th Oct^r 1823 to him and his heirs forever upon trust that he will be soon as the obligation shall become
due demand upon request of him the said Murfey or any time thereafter give legal notice and sell
the whole or any part of the said land and out of the proceeds pay the amount herein due from
the said Richmon^d to the said Murfey on one or more of the said obligation and the said Murfey agreeing
also to bear as the said demands are satisfied that he will release the premises herein contained
