This Indenture made this 25th day of December 1823 between James Freight of the one
part Amos Stephenson of the second part and Aunt Edwards of the third part all of the
County of Southampton and State of Virginia Whereas the said Aunt Edwards by her deed
dated the first day of October 1821 and admitted to record in the Clerk's Office of the County
Court aforesaid on the same day in order to secure the payment of the sum then due of the
sum of three hundred and sixty eight dollars and forty eight Cents with the legal
interest accruing thereon owing by him the said Aunt Edwards to Amos Stephenson
(who is since dead and by his last will and testament devised his whole estate to his son
Amos Stephenson by virtue of which said devise the said Amos Stephenson is become
entitled to the said debt due as aforesaid from the said Aunt Edwards to the said
Amos Stephenson &c) Conveyed in Trust to the said James Freight a certain Tract or
parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton being all that Tract of land
whereon the said Aunt Edwards then lived containing about one hundred and twenty nine
acres on the South side of Potomac River also One Negro slave called Sam with all his appurtenances
the appurtenances to the said Tract or parcel of land belonging or in any wise appertaining
and all the right title interest of the said Aunt Edwards in and to the said Tract of
land and the said sum of three hundred and sixty eight dollars and forty eight Cents
with the legal interest thereon accruing and all Cost attending the said debt interest having
been fully paid by the said Aunt Edwards to the said Amos Stephenson so that the said Aunt
Edwards has requested that the Estate Conveyed by the said deed in Trust to the said James
Freight be now released to him the said Aunt Edwards. This Indenture therefore
Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar by the said Aunt Edwards
to the said James Freight in hand paid before the sealing and delivery of these presents
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said James Freight with the Consent
of the said Amos Stephenson signified by his being a party hither have granted conveyed
released and forever quit claim and by these presents doth fully and absolutely grant
convey release and forever quit claim unto the said Aunt Edwards her heirs & assigns
forever all the right title interest property claim and demand whatsoever in Law
or equity of them and each of them the said James Freight and Amos Stephenson
to the said Aunt Edwards and assigns of in and to the above said Tract of Land with the
appurtenances and the said Negro slave Sam to the said Aunt Edwards her heirs & assigns
prior to this day use and behoof of the said Aunt Edwards her heirs & assigns
prior to what the said James Freight or Amos Stephenson is or has done or
or as Exec of Amos Stephenson or as attorney of them more than of their kind
