This Indenture made this 31st day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & twenty three between Harriet Tappin of the one part and William Tappin of the other part both of which shall for and in consideration of the sum of fifty one dollars to have the said Harriet Tappin in hand paid at an before the undersigned and delivery of these presents by the said William Tappin the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said Harriet Tappin hath granted bargained and sold aliened and conveyed and by these presents do grant bargain sell alien and convey unto the said William Tappin his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a corner piece standing on the side of Edmunds land a corner of said William Tappin thence along said Tappin land 225 000 poles thence 235 000 poles to the line of the Indian Swamp a corner of said William Tappin land and on Edmunds Tappin's line thence up said Swamp 135 14 13 poles thence 150 000 poles to a corner along the corner of Colclough and the Tappin thence along his Tappin line 250 76 16 poles to a corner Tappin's line thence along his line 255 14 102 to a corner piece corner of said Edmunds Tappin on Edmunds Edmunds land 1422 000 poles to the first station containing thirty four acres to the same marked lot to have and to hold the said bargain premises to have the said William Tappin his heirs and assigns forever and the sole and very perfect use benefit and behoof of have the said William Tappin his heirs and assigns forever and the said Harriet Tappin for herself her heirs and assigns as by these presents evancant and forever evancant and defend the said bargained premises against the claim claim or demand of all and all manner of persons whatsoever to have the said William Tappin his heirs and assigns forever he reserving to himself the said Harriet Tappin have built at his hand officers had and the day and date before written
