of said State and district in consideration of the sum of one thousand dollars to me  
paid by John Humphrey of said State and district of money the receipt  
whereof I do hereby acknowledge have bargained sold and quit claimed and by these  
presents do bargain sell and quit claim unto the said John Humphrey and to his  
heirs and assigns forever all my right title interest estate claim, and demand  
back at law and equity and as well as proportion as is convenience of me and to all  
my heirs or interests here. I now or ever may have in that certain tract or parcel of land  
lying and being within the State of Maryland in Southampton County Containing One  
hundred acres the same more or less on a part of said land lies in Southampton  
and a part in Chesapeake family of living the plantation wherein John Prince does  
formerly live and whereof his widow Elizabeth Prince now lives bounded by John  
Burdell Horne Barker and the heirs of said Prince with all and singularly the  
possessions and appurtenances thereto belonging on 10<sup>th</sup> day of May in the year of our Lord 1823.
