Know all men by these presents that I John Prince of said State and district in consideration of the sum of one thousand dollars to me in hand paid by John Humphrey of said State and district of Monro, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have bargained sold and quit claimed unto the said John Humphrey and to his heirs and assigns forever all my right title interest estate claim and demand both at Law and equity and as well in possession as in reversion of me and to all my claim or interest that I now or hereafter have in that certain tract or parcel of land lying and being within the State of Virginia in Southampton County containing Five Hundred acres be the same more or less or a part of said land lies in Southampton and a part in Stafford County it being the plantation whereon John Prince deceased formerly lived and which his widow Elizabeth Prince now bears bounded by John Wendell Mondle Parker and the heirs of said Prince with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging in unto of my hand and seal this 10th day of May in the year of our Lord 1823
