This Indenture made this 29th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three by and between and Amongst James Cooper of the first part Frederick Cobb of the second and John Gardner of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia witnesseth that the said James Cooper in order to have a debt due and owing from him to the said James Gardner as appears by a certain Note under date executed by the said John Gardner to the said Frederick Cobb for sum of thirty two dollars and forty four cents which Note bears equal date with these presents and is payable and taketh from the date and for the further Consideration of one dollar to him the said James Cooper or hand paid by the said John Gardner at an before the countersigning and delivery of these presents to the said James Cooper hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and Confirm unto him the said John Gardner and to his assigns forever a certain bed and furniture as soon as how two chest or Ward four brandy barrels four cedar barrels one logstaved all the earthen ware which he the said James Cooper now holds with exception one skin one tow gallon Keg one four potts on stone jars one case and basket there and thereunto to have and to hold the said property with all its incidents of any to him the said John Gardner and to his assigns forever upon the following Trust that is to say of the 5th January next that fail to pay and discharge the debt aforesaid with its growing interest and fine the first day of January next ensuing the date hereof that then the said John Gardner ad son as he shall be then required by the above named Frederick Cobb or his heirs or assigns shall immediately having given due on a sufficient Notice of the time and place of sale shall sell the same property for ready money and out of the money so raised he shall pay first the expenses owing to this present trust and then the debt aforesaid or so much as shall then remain due and unpaid and the balance if any to shall pay over to the said James Gardner to his heirs or assigns and is truly covenanted and agreed by and Between the parties of these presents that the said property shall remain in the peaceful possession of him the said James Cooper until a date shall be fixed under this present trust by the above named Frederick Cobb or his heirs or assigns Testimony whereof they the said John Gardner Frederick Cobb and John Gardner have set their hands and sealed this day and date first above written

This Indenture made this eighteenth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three by and between John Butts and Mary Williams his wife of the County of Southampton and parish of Saint Peter of the one part and George Blon of the County of Suffolk of the other part witnesseth that the said John Butts and Mary Williams his wife for an consideration of the sum of Money one dollars and four cents to have the said John Butts by him the said George Blon in Hand paid at or before the ratifying and delivering of these presents the receipt wherefor by the said John Butts fully acknowledge and thereof acquits and discharges him the said George Blon his Executors and Administrators All grants bargains lets alien seafalls and Conveyances and Confirms and by these presents do grant Bargains lets alien seafalls and Conveyances to the said George Blon his heirs and assigns all the right title interest as a claimant to the Lands now in the possession of Isidore Champion Young and Blon in the County of Southampton and Parish of Saint Peter and bounded partly by Nettleway River the Land of the said Blon and the plantation of James Butts deceased and a certain parcel to said James Champion has a dozen Right in which lands John Butts the wife and widow of William Butts deceased of said County and herself has a few small
