 part of the tract of Land lying in the County of Southampton whereof James Casper was seignior
 proprietor and being the tract of Land whereon the said Slave James Casper dwelt in his life time
 and to have the said tract of Land and premises with the Commodities Tussellments and all singular
 which is herein intended to be bargained and sold together with all and singular the appurtenances
 thereof belonging unto the said Annanta Williams her heirs and assigns forever And the said Annanta
 Williams for herself and her heirs the said Tract of Land and premises with all and singular
 the appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Henry Williams his heirs assigns free from the
 claims or claims of him the said Annanta Williams his heirs assigns of late and to come as well
 persons whatsoever in Shale Law And as Comproffessor and assign forever by these presents & without taking
