This Indenture made this 13th day of September in the year 1823 between William Bell and Billy Bell wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and Samuel Cobb of the other part witnesseth that the said William Bell and Billy his wife in consideration of the sum of two hundred and twenty dollars to him for Conto Current money of Virginia to them or her paid by the said Samuel Cobb at or before the recording and delivery of this premise the wright Cobbs is fully acknowledged hath given granted bargained and sold and by their presents do grant bargaine and sell unto the said Samuel Cobb his heirs and assigns a certain parcel or tract of land containing eighty four and a half acres being a part of the tract wherein the said Bell now lies and bounded as follows beginning at a tree a few feet from a line tree in the said Bell and Cobb line on the mule path thence along the said line to a tree on a small branch thence down the said branch to a pine marked tree & so far as the said branch on the said Bell's line and the mule trail thence along the said line to the mule drawn by a gun carriage road thence down the said trail down to a hillside opposite at the junction of the main run of said stream and the run from the first gated of the mule path thence north 56° W. 10 poles to Kendall's tree thence along the said line to a run made corner (a dog wood) for the said Bell and Cobb in the said Kendall's tree there a run line North 1. West to a buckeye on the mule path thence up the said mule path to the beginning into the said Samuel Cobb his heirs or assigns to have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereto belonging and the said William Bell and Billy his wife for whom Bell's heirs and executors shall and administer unto the said lands or parcels unto him the said Samuel Cobb his heirs or assigns shall and will forever warrant and defend.
