 and Edwards White of the other part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia West Virginie that whereas the said Achelias
 Williams died by a certain deed bearing date August 23/1820 sold and convey to Amos Brown a certain tract of
 Land bounded on the east by the south line of Southampton and hath not since been fully paid and admitted of record And the said Amos
 Brown having sold to the said Achelias Williams the tract above mentioned and the said Achelias Williams being willing
 to make the title good to the said Amos Brown for the said Achelias Williams for the consideration of
 and the said Amos Brown for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand and fifty dollars or thereabouts
 by the said Edwards White the receipt whereof the said Amos Brown doth hereby acknowledge full and clear
 and sole claim therof And by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell unto the said Edwards White his heirs and
